There will be a wide range of other local NHS services available during this time including:

NHS 111

For urgent medical help, go straight to NHS 111. You can either call 111 or go online at <u>www.111.nhs.uk</u>. You will be asked questions about your main symptom and directed to NHS services and medical help near you. NHS 111 is open 24/7, 365 days a year.

Pharmacies

Pharmacies are open across the Easter Bank Holiday weekend; including some on Easter Sunday. Pharmacies can help with a range of things including aches, hangovers, colds, emergency contraception, and non-prescription medication.
